- An act or habit of misusing words ridiculously, especially by the confusion of words that are similar in sound

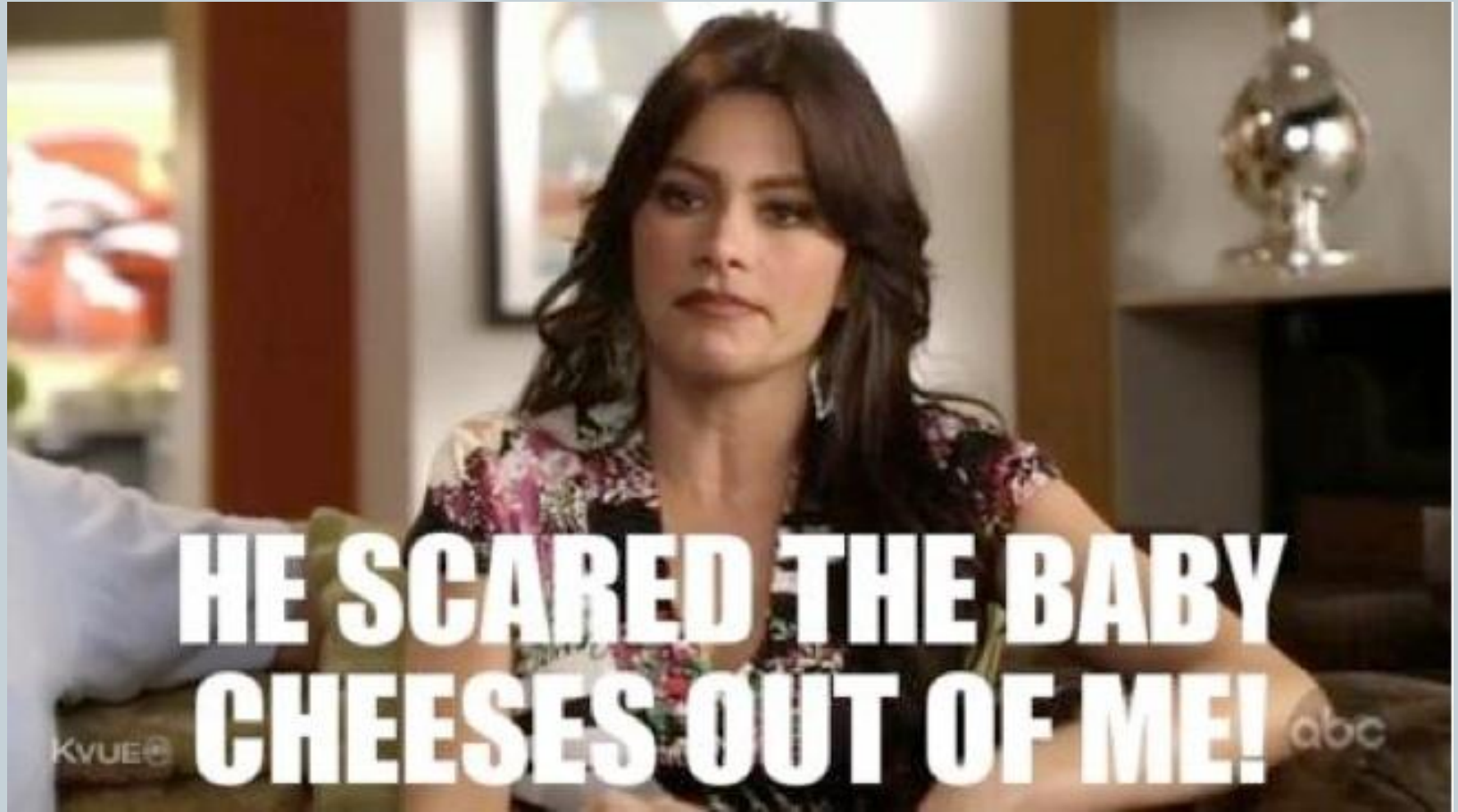

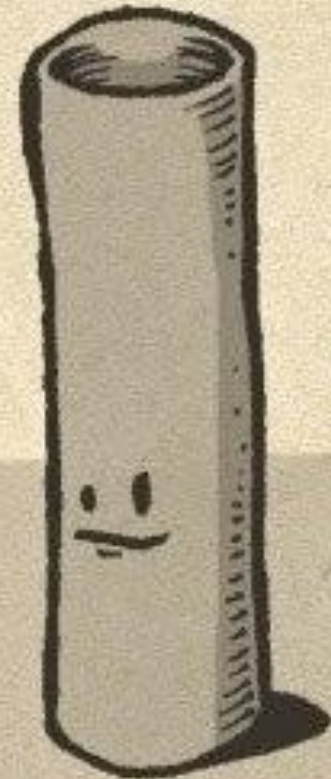
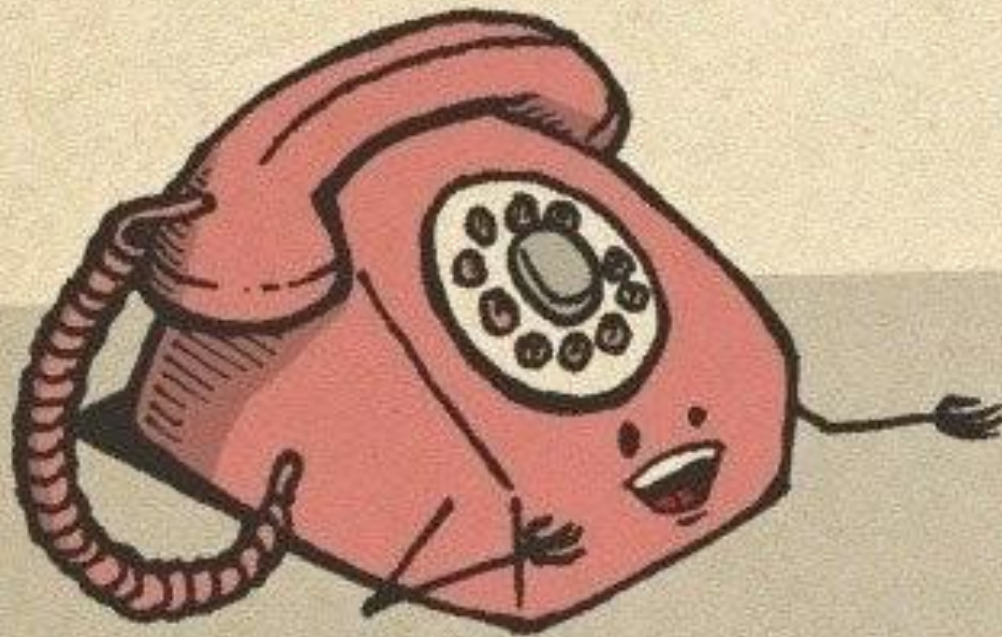

Farce



- Farce is the concept of an otherwise un-comical individual or group of individuals finding themselves in an absurd situation, which may hence prove to be comical. It is perhaps the best documented of all forms of comedy, the origins of most modern day farces starting from Shakespeare's comedies.

Caricature



- In literature, a **caricature** is a description of a person using exaggeration of some characteristics and oversimplification of others. **Caricatures** can be insulting or complimentary and can serve a political purpose or be drawn solely for entertainment.



Burlesque



- Burlesque is an outrageous imitation of something that is supposed to be taken seriously
- You can either elevate something lowly and ridiculous (high burlesque) or trivialize something lofty and important (low burlesque).
- Alexander Pope's "The Rape of the Lock",



Travesty



- An exaggerated or grotesque imitation.
If you do not know what grotesque is- it's definition is- bizarre in character or appearance.
- It's different from a parody because a parody is exaggerating it in a silly way. a travesty is exaggerating something with a serious tone.
