Teamwork Tips

When you work together with other students in a group, follow these tips:

- Encourage all members to contribute to the work of the group.
- Respect everyone's contributions. There should be no putdowns.
- Be prepared to compromise.
- Keep focused on the task at hand.
- Support the group's final decisions.

Instructions

In teams of 4-5, use the consensus decision making process to build the tallest free standing tower using the following materials:

- 10 sheets of paper
- 2 metres of masking tape
- sheet of scrap paper (for design)
- 1 small piece of paper (for flag)
- metre stick(s) to measure structure
- scissors

Building the tower

- 1. Your team has three tasks:
- In the time allowed, design and build the tallest possible free-standing tower using 10 sheets of legal paper and two metres of masking tape.
- Make sure that everyone in your team takes turns and participates equally in the activity.
- Make a flag for the top of your tower that identifies your team.
- 2. There are several roles in your team, which could include:
- Materials manager The materials manager should obtain a set of materials for your team.
- Designer the designer should consult with the team and sketch a design (blueprint), using the team's suggestions. When all team members have accepted the design, they should sign the design sheet and show Mr. Johnson.
- Cutter/Tape Assembler The cutter and tape-assembler should build the tower.
- Time-manager The time-manager should make sure that everyone stays on task and completes the task in the time allowed.
- Artist The artist should consult with the team to design a flag for the top of the tower.
- Other If your group has more than 5 members, create a new role(s). Each person must have a role. Decide in your team how you will make sure that everyone participates equally. Good-luck!

- 7. What did you like most about the team's work? Was there anything you disliked?
- 8. Was there a visible leader(s) of the team? What qualities made them an effective leader?
